Letter to the Editor

Dear Editor

I want to thank Dave Sanders for his very good article on his Christchurch Earthquake story – ten years after. He tells the graphic story of one person's experience in the inner city shambles, the difficulty in getting home, and the years and years of fighting insurance companies for pay-out. I also heard Garry McCormick tell of his experiences on that day. He was in a city radio station and couldn't contact his wife also in Lyttelton, to find out how she and their ten day old twins were. The recollection was so intense that he broke down on national radio.

These two snapshots brought home to me what a devastating time Christchurch and Canterbury people have had. The rest of the country might have become quite complacent about the

'resilience' of Cantabrians. and how tired we might have become about their insurance claims, and the rebuilding of their city. What I hadn't truly appreciated was the significant toll the earthquakes and the aftershocks had taken on normal, average human beings - or even strong ones. It looks to me like Post Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD) on a city scale, and it is still very close to the surface.

Margaret and I come from solid Canterbury families and have been watching our families and friends claw their way up for breath. I am very grateful for Dave sharing his story and reliving the intensity of his experience, and hopefully giving us all a bit of insight and tolerance into what others have been going through. And Dave; we are pleased that you have found Karamea to 'create new opportunities'.



Homemade Ginger Beer -

To make ginger beer you need in the first place a ginger bug. To "make" a bug, grate organic ginger in a jar and add a spoon of sugar and some water. Repete this process everyday until you have bubbles.

For 4 litres of Drink:

- 4 litres of water
- 75g of ginger
- 250 gr of sugar
- 50 gr of honey
- 65 ml of ginger bug

Boil 1.5 litres of water with the ginger for 15 minutes.

Then add sugar, honey and others flavour.

Add the rest of cold water and wait until the mix is at 40°C or lower before you can add the bug.

Let it ferment 2 to 4 days (according the ambiante temperature) and bottle it.

Leave them out of the fridge for another 2 days and open / close the lid to let the gas going out. Then put the bottle in the fridge and consume within 3 weeks.

Feed your bug regularly with sugar, water and grated ginger.

Changes at the Karamea recycling and dump site

Having received the letter from the Buller District Council on the changes at the Karamea "Transfer station" I think the Karamea community should know the following facts.

The cost of \$98 per rateable property for solid waste management x 644 rateable properties in the Karamea District=\$63,112.00.

\$63,112.00 divided by \$4 per KM for a truck to take recycling the Christchurch = 15,778km divided by 854 km Karamea Christchurch return= 18.47 trips to Christchurch and back.

Considering BDC is only taking plastics #1 #2 #5 and tin cans over 18 trucks a year is way over the top.

Buller District Council is no longer using the official refuse bags and charging \$5.80 per 60 Litre Rubbish bag. I went and measured the size of the hole that has been created from quarrying and crushing of road gravel for the local roads.

The easiest way to measure the hole is to treat it as three pits.

Pit 1 dump face 26m x 29m x 8m

Pit 2 right hand side dump 100m x 15m x8m

Pit 3 right hand side east end 35m x 65m x 8m

=36,232 cubic meters.

A 60 Litre rubbish bag compacted with a 5 ton digger will reduce to approximately 20 litres, one third of its original size.

50 x 20 Litre compacted bags to the cubic metre.

 $510 \times $5.80 = 290.00 one cubic metre compacted land fill.

=\$290 per cubic metre x 36,200 cubic meters = \$10,498,000 to fill a hole that was dug to remove roading gravel.

PLUS \$63,112.00 PER YEAR IN RECYCLING FEES.

Even if the hole was filled with 5 cubic meter truck loads tare weight of 7+ tonne \$525 per load = \$3,801,000

If the community is paying this amount to fill a hole I believe the revenue should be held for the purpose of engineering the next dump site as without doubt if will have to be lined and compliant with the land fill regulations. If the money raised is put in the Buller District Councils coffers then we will all be up for yet another rates rise when the current site is full.

If there is any doubt as to the figures and measurements please do the calculations yourself. All measurements were done with a tape measure from the foot of the walls and were very conservative.

We all need a helping hand from time to time.



Tall tales Co-op has evolved from Greymouth-based, Kiwi/Possum Productions and is exploring the ancient art of storytelling. 


